

(Knoxville, TN) James Rufus Agee (1909-1955) was one of America's most gifted writers. Only six when his father died in an automobile accident, he later wrote about the tragedy in the Pulitzer Prize-winning novel, *A Death in the Family*, set in his hometown of Knoxville. One-third of Agee's short years were spent in East Tennessee. In a Brown Bag Lecture on Wednesday, July 10, Paul F. Brown will give us a more in depth look into the life of one of Knoxville's most famous citizens. Brown draws on journals and correspondence to produce a compelling account of Agee's formative years.

Paul F. Brown is an independent researcher and author of *Rufus: James Agee in Tennessee*. He has published articles and lectured on James Agee at various forums and is a consultant for a forthcoming documentary on Agee. Brown teaches music at Coalfield School in Morgan County, Tennessee. Books will be available for purchase and signing following the program.
